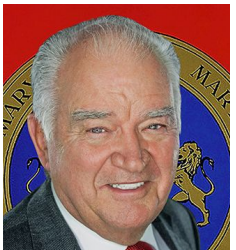

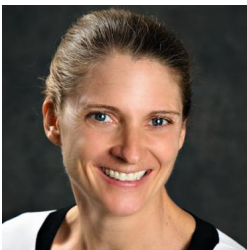

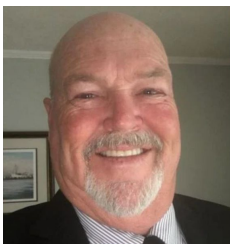

2022 BALLOT QUESTIONS

Vote YES on Maryland Constitutional Question 1:

Changes the name of the Maryland Court of Appeals to the Supreme Court of Maryland and changes the name of the Maryland Court of Special Appeals to the Appellate Court of Maryland.

The name changes reflect the actual purposes of the courts and uses names consistent with those used in the federal court system.

Vote YES on Maryland Constitutional Question 2:

Amends the Maryland Constitution to require that state legislators to both reside and maintain a place of abode in the district they wish to represent for six months prior to the date of election. ensures that a candidate who is a “legal resident” in his district must also live there. This corrects a court case that allowed a candidate to run in a district he'd moved away from.

Vote NO on Maryland Constitutional Question 3:

Amends the Maryland Constitution to permit the legislature to increase the amount needed to have trial by jury in civil proceedings from \$15,000 to \$25,000. Maryland is one of a the few states that limit a civil right to trial, and this amendment limits the right to a trial by jury even more.

Vote NO on Maryland Constitutional Question 4:

Amends the Maryland Constitution to legalize adult-use recreational marijuana and direct the legislature to pass law for the use, distribution, regulation, and taxation of marijuana.

Vote NO on Maryland Constitutional Question 5:

Amends the Maryland Constitution to require the Howard County Circuit Court judges to sit as the Orphans' Court for Howard County. This removes Howard County's citizens' right to vote for Orphan's Court Judges and opens the door for the state to remove St. Mary's County citizens' right as well
